

Residential and Employment Services for people with I/DD and autism



VCP network agencies provide services and supports to over 4,500 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities through Home and Community Based Service (HCBS) waivers, Flexible Family Funding (FFF), Bridge Program, and Family Managed Respite (FMR).

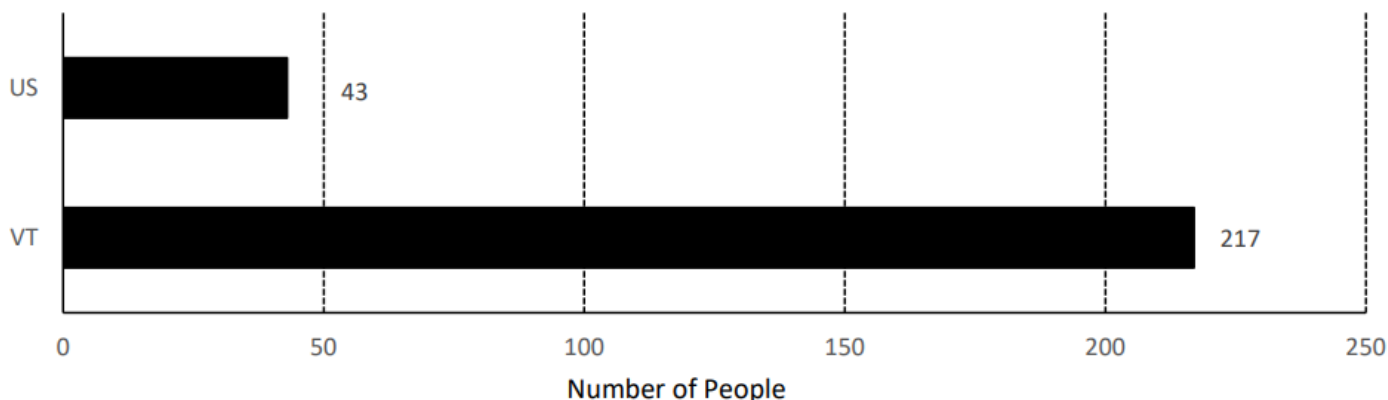
RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

- Over 1500 people received 24-hour paid home supports through Shared Living, Staffed Living and Group Living programs.
- “I love my home” and “Need more staff” satisfaction survey comments show that while many people have received the services they need, some are still waiting.
- The majority of individuals receiving residential services live in a Shared Living Provider arrangement, but that’s changing. With 78% of people who say they like where they live**, agencies are working to expand housing options so all feel at home where they live.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

- Employment supports are best when they are individualized and person-centered
- In 2021 677 people were working and 252 were in job development. 260 people were still furloughed due to the pandemic.
- 77% of graduates from Post-secondary Education initiatives go on to get jobs
- Staff shortages limit Supported Employment services
